Warren County Foundation - Year In Review

To the Community:

The 2017-18 fiscal year was very positive for the Warren County Foundation. The awareness level of the Foundation, its mission, and its activities was enhanced through the Foundation website, speaking engagements, the Lebanon and Springboro Expos, engagement in County issues, and work with many County organizations and individuals.



Not only did we continue to help our many donors achieve their charitable goals, we provided grant support to many worthwhile charitable organizations across Warren County through Impact Grants and Discretionary Grants. The Impact Grant program is the centerpiece of our strategic plan to improve quality of life issues across the County. In 2017 we were able to award four Impact Grants. This was increased to six Impact Grants in 2018.

One of the new initiatives supported by the Foundation is the establishment of the Women's Fund of Warren County. The mission of the Women's Fund is to be the leading advocate through funding of change for women and girls in Warren County.

On behalf of the Board of Trustees, we thank all of the individuals, organizations, and businesses that have already partnered with the Foundation. We welcome the opportunity to discuss charitable giving and charitable fund management options with anyone interested in the Foundation's services.

The Warren County Foundation continues to support the quality of life issues in the County.

IMPACT GRANTS AWARDED FOR 2018

The Warren County Foundation awarded six \$10,000 Impact Grants in 2018. The Grants Committee recently approved four Impact Grants in November. Two from funds raised from the Board of Trustees and other donors and two anonymously. The four Impact Grants went to Abuse & Rape Crisis Shelter, Countryside YMCA, Greater Cincinnati Center for Economic Education, and United Way of Warren County.

IMPACT GRANTS AWARDED FOR 2018 continued

Earlier in the year, two Impact Grants were awarded from the George and Mary Alice Leasure Fund to Camp Kern and Countryside YMCA. Additional funding continues for the Workforce Development Initiative by United Way of Warren County which received an Impact Grant in 2017.

The Abuse & Rape Crisis Shelter is providing a professional Advocate to educate and train Warren County Human Services staff on recognizing the signs on Intimate Partner and Family Violence. ARCS will assist in the development of creating policy and procedures within the agencies on Trauma-Informed Response and Referral Protocols. During the process, ARCS will provide advocacy and support to all survivors identified and referred to the Community-based Advocate.

The Countryside YMCA C.A.R.E.S. program is building relationships that foster Compassion, Academics, Resources, Empowerment, and Support to help families in the community who are at the most risk. The program will help expand awareness in the community by making the outreach programs more recognizable and understandable to those in need. Some of the programs include: Countryside YMCA Early Learners Program; Homework Club; and Kids to Camp. A new program, Parent Resource Center, is being added.

The Greater Cincinnati Center for Economic Education will provide 100 Warren County K-12 educators with a free, in-person professional development training on how to integrate economics and personal finance into standard classroom instruction. The sessions will provide educators with financial literacy curricular resources that can easily integrate into the core content teaching areas – particularly mathematics, English language arts, and social studies.

United Way of Warren County launched a Volunteer Resource Center in July 2018. The current budget pays for office space. The Impact Grant will provide funding to scale the program and accelerate growth. The purpose of the Volunteer Resource Center is to provide volunteer opportunities, aligned with UWWCs community impact goals. The three primary strategic goals include: school readiness; workforce development, and basic/emergency needs.

Additional Impact Grants were awarded earlier in the year from the George and Mary Alice Leasure Fund to Camp Kern and Countryside YMCA. Camp Kern through the YMCA of Greater Dayton has provided meaningful summer camp experiences to youth since 1910. The Impact Grant is used to provide financial assistance (scholarships) to families who would not otherwise be able to afford a camp experience for their children.

The other Impact Grant was awarded to the Countryside YMCA to support **LIVESTRONG**, a free 12-week research-based physical activity and well-being program designed to help adult cancer survivors reclaim their total health. Annually, over 500 people in Warren County are diagnosed with cancer.

The Impact Grant program is part of the Foundation's strategic plan. The Warren County Foundation Impact Grant program will continue in 2019 with applications available next August.

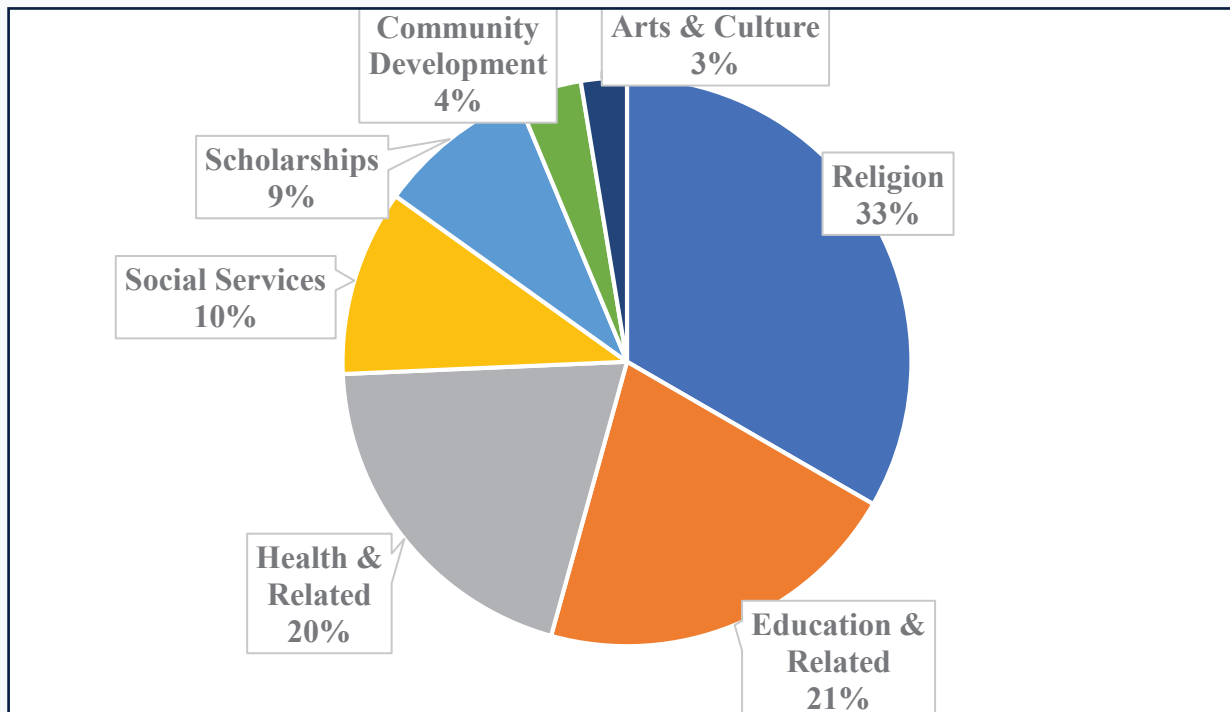

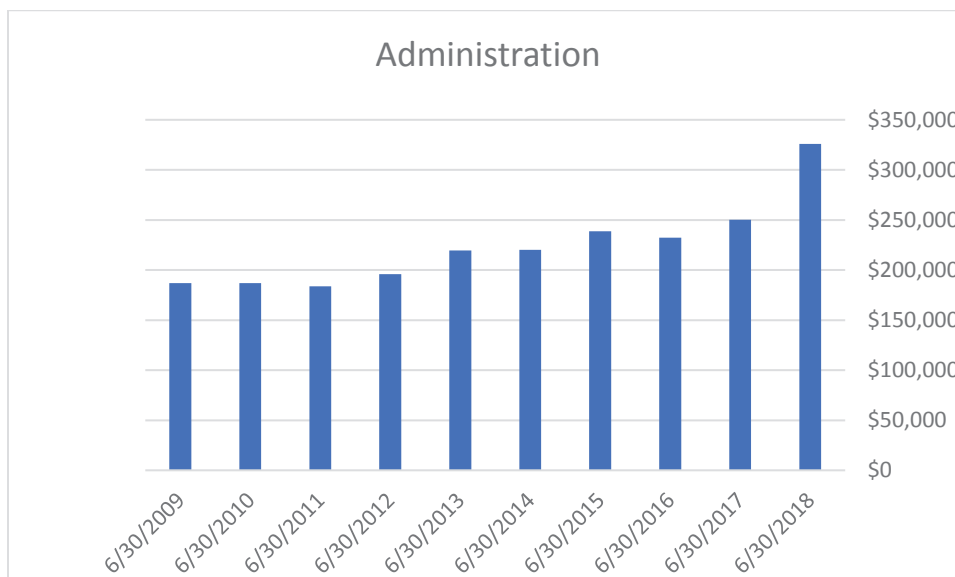
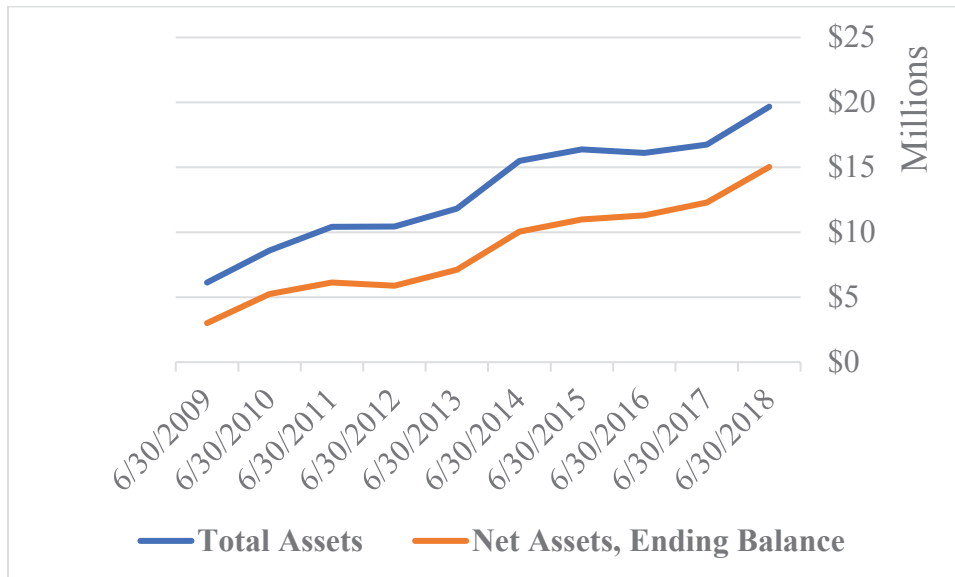

The Warren County Foundation, incorporated September 19, 1997, has completed 21 years. Total assets grew to over \$19.6 million in the last year. Several important relationships produced the significant growth with the addition of designated and donor advised funds. As the strategic plan is implemented, the Foundation will have a solid base for continued success.



The combined Warren County Foundation and Warren County Foundation Depository financial statements excerpted in this report are internal financial statements. We are audited annually by VonLehman & Company Inc., Certified Public Accountants. Audited financial statements are available upon request.

THE WOMEN'S FUND OF WARREN COUNTY

The Mission of the Women's Fund of Warren County is to be the leading advocate through funding of change for women and girls in Warren County. The Fund invests in systems change and programs that improve the lives of women and children in the County. The Women's Fund is not its own 501(c)(3) organization. The Warren County Foundation is the non-profit entity and has the legal and fiduciary obligations for the Women's Fund operations. The Women's Fund of Warren County is a separate sub-organization operated by the Fund's Leadership Council. The Leadership Council includes elected officers for Chair; Chair-Elect; Secretary/Treasurer; and Past Chair; and the Chairs of the working committees of the Women's Fund. Officers and committee members are individuals who have joined the Women's Fund with three-year financial commitments.

The current working committees include: Governance; Membership; Program; and Grant Review. The Governance Committee is establishing the mode of operations for the Fund and will evaluate the ongoing operations of the Fund. The Membership Committee will promote the Fund and organize ongoing recruitment of new members. The Program Committee will establish the meeting schedule for the Fund and facilitate educational programs, social opportunities and community programs. The Grant Review Committee will review grant proposals, narrow and submit proposals to the entire membership for voting, and oversee the grantmaking process. The Grants Review Committee shall not include any member who is a grant applicant. Members in good standing will vote on the allocation of grants from the Women's Fund.
